## Making your Career Story engaging for young people

- Be yourself! This will provide the most authentic tone and give a clear understanding of your journey.
- Wear work clothes.
- Have fun with it.
- Tell an anecdote related to your career journey.
- Where possible, show a little of your workplace and work equipment.
- Provide tips you would give to someone entering the workforce, or seeking a career in your industry/role.
- Think about a key message for your younger self.
- Speak from your passion and from your heart – be real.
- Consider including things associated with your work – environments and equipment help to bring your job to life.

## How to record a Career Story

Career Stories can be recorded on your phone, digital camera or webcam (search ‘camera’ on your computer). We are striving for raw and authentic videos. Record the video in your work place if possible. If recording on a phone it is best to hold the phone in landscape position.

Please try to shoot videos in one go where possible to avoid any editing requirements. However, if this is not possible, please submit all parts of your Career Story at the same time.

### Practical considerations:

- **Lighting** – beware harsh sunlight both indoors and out. Don’t sit with the sun/window behind you as you will be hard to see in the video.
- **Noise** – if your workplace is noisy, consider filming a snippet in that environment but move somewhere quieter for most of your narrative. Beware of wind noise if filming outside.
- **Camera technique** – unless you are walking through your workplace, try to keep the camera still – prop it on a bookcase for instance. Do a short test and view it before recording your full story.
- **Time limit** - set a timer to keep you on track! If someone else is recording, ask them to give you a hand signal when your time is nearly up.
- **Intellectual Property/Privacy** – Authentic workplaces make great backdrops, however think about the background you are displaying and ensure there is no sensitive information visible on screens, walls or workspaces.
- **Consent** – ensure you provide Beacon with a signed *Participant Material Consent Form* for ALL people who appear in your video.
